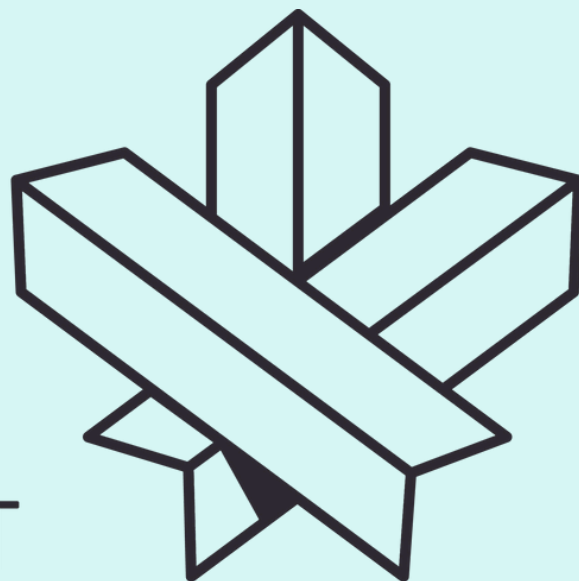


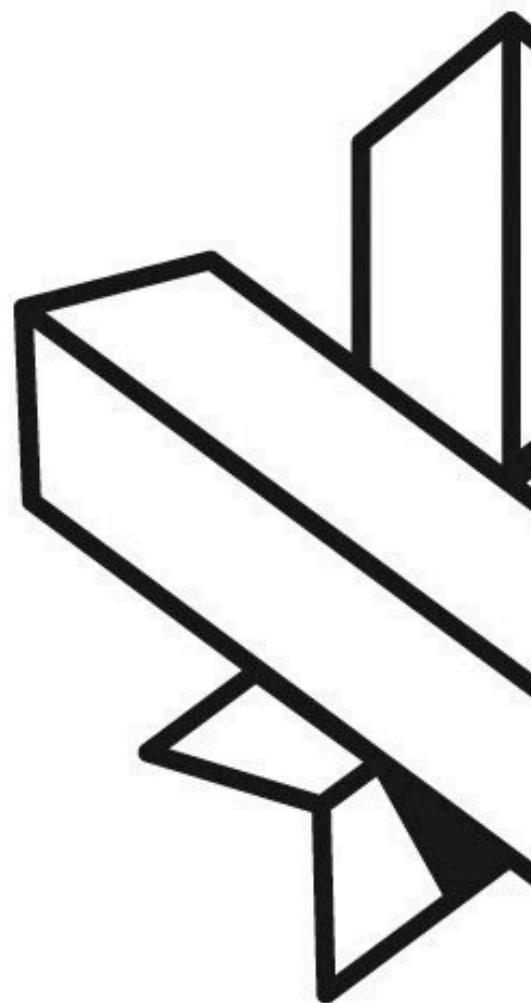

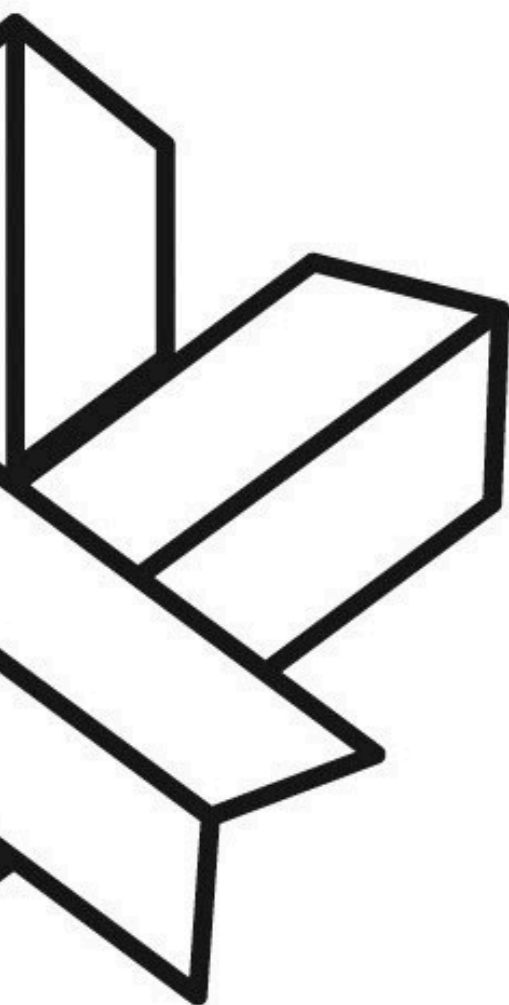

The **2025 Ellen Meiksins Wood Prize** was awarded to economics and politics commentator **Grace Blakeley** for critical analysis of economic systems and neoliberalism capitalism that helps movements take back democratic power for the working-class.

PressProgress

Founded in 2013, **PressProgress** is an editorially independent news division of the Broadbent Institute.

PressProgress stories are among the most shared in Canada and read by several million Canadians every year.

Reporting has been cited as a reliable news source by top news organizations in Canada and around the world.

PressProgress prioritizes stories that fall under the following areas:

- Big business and labour
- Healthcare and education
- Social and economic inequality
- Right-wing politics and far-right extremism
- Civic institutions and threats to democracy

PressProgress operates on a **reader-powered, non-profit** model. It does not rely on advertising, sponsored content or paywalls for revenue. It receives funding through the Broadbent Institute and through a dedicated small-donor membership program — the average monthly donation is under \$10 from ordinary readers across Canada.

All of the content published by *PressProgress* is the original and independent work of a team of editors and reporters, and is produced according to *PressProgress* **Journalistic Standards** that are publicly available.

PressProgress is a member of the **National NewsMedia Council**, a voluntary, self-regulatory body for Canada's news media industry that promotes ethical journalistic practices.

Full-time editorial and reporting positions for *PressProgress* are governed under a collective agreement with **United Food and Commercial Workers Local 1006A**.

The story so far

PressProgress is at the centre of what could be one of the biggest, longest and most expensive media trials in Canadian history, brought forward against us and other trusted news organizations like *CBC News* and the *Toronto Star* by a former candidate for Jason Kenney's United Conservative Party in Alberta.

The trial is focused on an important story *PressProgress* broke during Alberta's 2019 provincial election, involving leaked messages between Caylan Ford and a fellow conservative politician making controversial statements on topics about race, immigration and white-supremacist terrorism. Ford later announced her resignation, and Kenney publicly condemned her comments.

Since announcing her resignation, Ford has expressed her personal opinions about our journalism and setting out her alternative version of the facts. Ford even lodged a formal complaint with Elections Alberta about *PressProgress*, which Alberta's Chief Electoral Officer investigated and ultimately dismissed.

Now Ford is moving forward with a multimillion-dollar lawsuit against us, as well as several other defendants.

The issue is this lawsuit was filed in Alberta. In some provinces, like Ontario and BC, news organizations can sometimes use anti-SLAPP legislation to challenge lawsuits when they believe they are groundless or undermine the public interest. Anti-SLAPP legislation gives defendants an opportunity to make those arguments before a judge before they ever get to trial.

Alberta has no such legislation, leaving journalists who report on wealthy and powerful people in that province vulnerable to potentially long and expensive legal battles.

This lawsuit is so much bigger than *PressProgress* — it could have serious implications for every journalist, civil society group and citizen in Canada. The verdict risks setting chilling and long-lasting precedents for press freedoms and democracy in Canada. In a free and democratic society, journalists have a right to quote the words of politicians, and that is what we did when we accurately quoted Ford's own words.

We're not backing down. We stand by our reporting. And we defend ourselves against any and all legal threats.

Ed Broadbent's social democratic values and ideas are vital to the debates and dilemmas of today. Making Ed's work accessible will foster greater public engagement with the ideas he championed, encouraging meaningful conversations about the role of government, community, and the individual in shaping our future.

The **Ed Broadbent Digital Archive** will serve as a vital resource for researchers, educators, students, policymakers and anyone interested in the history of Canadian politics, economic and social policy, the labour movement and civil society, and in democratic leadership and practice.

This initiative is led by Ed's *Seeking Social Democracy* co-authors **Luke Savage** and **Frances Abele**, in collaboration with Carleton University.

With materials uncovered and digitized from Library and Archives Canada, University of Toronto Libraries, and Ed's personal effects such as op-eds, memos, correspondence, recordings, and archival news footage, the new resource aims to preserve Ed's intellectual work and celebrate a giant of Canadian social democracy.

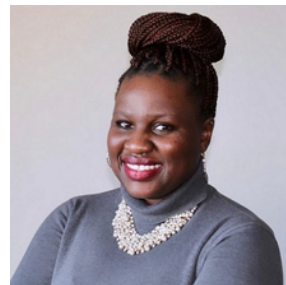

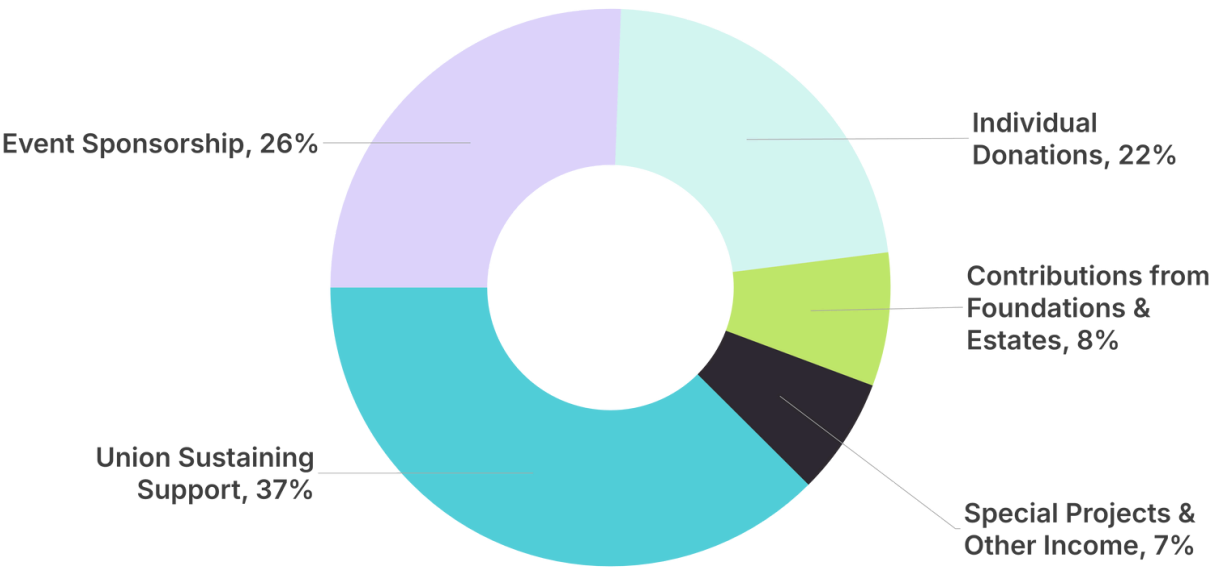

ED BROADBENT

P.C., C.C. (1936-2024)



A champion for ordinary Canadians and tireless advocate for democratic institutions, **Ed Broadbent** was devoted to improving the lives of all Canadians. Throughout his seven decade career, Broadbent fought for justice and equality, making great strides in the advancement of the rights of disadvantaged persons. Broadbent will be remembered as a great thinker whose kindness, charisma and sense of humour could bring Canadians together.

Born in Oshawa, Ontario, in 1936, John Edward Broadbent demonstrated an interest in politics at a young age. As a high school student, he paid attention to the role democratic institutions could play in improving all lives, and thus was born his passion and dedication to the fight for equal rights. He earned a degree in philosophy from the University of Toronto, graduating in 1959. Broadbent then pursued postgraduate studies at the London School of Economics, before returning to the University of Toronto where he obtained a doctorate in political theory, graduating in 1966.

Ed Broadbent was elected to the House of Commons in 1968 as a member of the New Democratic Party of Canada (NDP). He was a member of Parliament for the riding of Oshawa-

Whitby for seven years before becoming leader of the NDP in 1975, a position he held until 1989, when he retired from politics. During his 14-year leadership, Broadbent argued for the abolition of capital punishment, and advocated for the rights of same-sex couples to marry. He also focused his efforts on Indigenous rights, women's equality, child poverty, ethics in government, electoral reform and tax equality.

During his leadership of the NDP, Broadbent served as vice-president of the Socialist International from 1979 to 1989, under the presidency of Willy Brandt, former Chancellor of the Federal Republic of Germany. Between 1990 and 1996, Ed Broadbent served as president of the International Centre for Human Rights and Democratic Development, a non-partisan independent Canadian institution that promoted peace and justice around the world. He made a brief return to the House of Commons from 2004 to 2006 when he was elected as member of Parliament for Ottawa Centre, under the NDP leadership of Jack Layton.

In 2011, Ed Broadbent founded the Broadbent Institute as a social democratic think tank to produce original research, convene progressive dialogues, and train organizers and leaders to equip social movements working to advance justice and equality. He remained active as founder and as member of the Institute's Board of Directors while teaching political science at several universities in Canada and abroad.

Ed Broadbent has been recognized by many for his accomplishments. He notably received several honorary doctorates and was made a Companion of the Order of Canada in 2001. His devotion to public life leaves behind a lasting legacy, moving Canada towards a more just and inclusive society. Ed Broadbent was honoured in January 2024 with a state funeral service celebrating his life's work and dedication to social justice and equality.

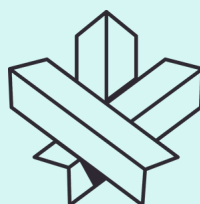
